Risk Assessment and Management- Ashburton Art Gallery and Museum

Safety is our priority. Our policy is to identify and mitigate hazards as they become apparent.

The following pages are designed to help teachers complete the Management Statements for a Gallery and Museum visit.

We recommend that teachers visit the Art Gallery and Museum prior to their class visit to familiarise themselves with the Art Gallery, Museum and the hazards here within.

School Visit Guidelines

There is a recommended ratio of (1:5) for years 0-3, (1:8) primary and (1:15) secondary, adults to students. Unless prior arrangement with Art Gallery and Museum staff.

Conduct

Appropriate behaviour for an Art Gallery and Museum visit includes: walking only, touching items only when permitted to and being spatially and vocally aware of other members of the community sharing gallery space. Stairs, hard floor surfaces, corners to exhibition cases/displays, and fragile items are common hazards

First Aid

All Museum staff who work with school groups are first aid qualified and trained to provide a response in an emergency. First aid kits are readily accessible in all areas of the Museum and a mobile kit and cell phone are taken on all off-site activities.

Food and Drink

The consumption of food and drink in the gallery spaces is not allowed. We ask that you strictly observe this rule as part of conditions of entry.

School Bags

There is no designated space for school bags in the Art Gallery or Museum. It is suggested that bags be left at school or on the bus if possible.

Emergency

Emergency signals are communicated by alarms. Museum staff are trained in emergency and evacuation procedures.
